#### ORDINANCE # 2002-21

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE HERNANDO COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES, CHAPTER 23 - PLANNING; BY AMENDING ARTICLE I, SECTION 23-3, THE HERNANDO COUNTY COMPREHENSIVE PLAN BY AMENDING THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS ELEMENT; AMENDING THE TRANSPORTATION ELEMENT; AMENDING THE FUTURE LAND USE MAP, THE YEAR 2015 FUNCTIONALLY CLASSIFIED ROADWAY NETWORK MAP, AND THE YEAR 2015 FUNCTIONAL CLASSIFICATION AND MAINTENANCE RESPONSIBILITY MAP OF SECTION E SPECIAL FEATURES MAPS OF HERNANDO COUNTY, FLORIDA; AND ADDING AN ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT ELEMENT; PURSUANT TO THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT COMPREHENSIVE PLANNING AND LAND DEVELOPMENT REGULATION ACT, CHAPTER 163, PART II, FLORIDA STATUTES: PROVIDING FOR INCLUSION IN THE CODE: PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Chapter 163, Part II, Florida Statutes also known as the Local Government
Comprehensive Planning and Land Development Regulation Act, Chapter 9J-5, Florida
Administrative Code, also known as the Minimum Criteria for Review of Local Government
Comprehensive Plans and Plan Amendments, Evaluation and Appraisal Reports, Land
Development Regulations and Determinations of Compliance, and Chapter 9J-11, Florida
Administrative Code, also known as the Governing the Procedure for the Submittal and Review
of Local Government Comprehensive Plans and Amendments, require that Hernando County
prepare, adopt a Comprehensive Plan; and

WHEREAS, Hernando County has prepared a Comprehensive Plan consisting of the following elements: Future Land Use Element; Mining Element; Transportation Element; Housing Element; Sanitary Sewer Element; Solid Waste Element; Drainage and Natural Groundwater Aquifer Recharge Element; Potable Water Element; Coastal Management Element; Conservation Element; Recreation and Open Space Element; Intergovernmental Coordination Element; Capital Improvements Element; and the following additional sections: Capital Improvements Implementation; Procedures for Monitoring and Evaluation; Future Land Use Map-Mapping Criteria & Land Uses Allowed; and Special Features Maps of Hernando County, Florida; and

WHEREAS, Hernando County has held public hearings to provide for and encourage public participation through out the plan preparation process; and

WHEREAS, Hernando County did submit a proposed Comprehensive Plan Amendment, which consists of: a revised Capital Improvements Element; revised policies of the Transportation Element; a revised Future Land Use Map, a revised and renamed 2015 Functionally Classified

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Roadway Network Map, and a revised and renamed 2015 Functional Classification and Maintenance Responsibility Map, all of Section E Special Feature Maps of Hernando County, Florida; and the addition of an Economic Development Element, to be incorporated into the adopted Hernando County Comprehensive Plan. The proposed amendment package was received by the State Land Planning Agency for preliminary review on August 29, 2002; and

WHEREAS, the State Land Planning Agency did review and did not raise objections to the proposed plan amendment and transmitted their Objections, Recommendations and Comments Report in writing to Hernando County; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners did consider the Objections, Recommendations and Comments of the State Land Planning Agency and did hold a public hearing on December 11, 2002; and

WHEREAS, all applicable substantive and procedural requirements of law have been met; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF HERNANDO COUNTY, FLORIDA:

SECTION ONE. THE HERNANDO COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES, CHAPTER 23, SECTION 3, THE HERNANDO COUNTY COMPREHENSIVE PLAN IS HEREBY AMENDED AS FOLLOWS:

The Hernando County Comprehensive Plan Amendment CPAM-02-02 (DCA No. 02-2), attached as Appendices A-D, which consist of: an annual update of the Capital Improvements Element; amendments to the goals, objectives, and policies of the Transportation Element; updates and corrections to the Future Land Use Map of Section E Special Features Maps of Hernando County, Florida; revisions to the 2015 Functionally Classified Roadway Network Map of Section E Special Features Maps of Hernando County, Florida, including renaming said map to Highway Network Map 2020; revisions to the 2015 Functional Classification and Maintenance Responsibility Map of Section E Special Features Maps of Hernando County, Florida, including renaming said map to Functionally Classified Roadway Map 2020; and adding an Economic Development Element; all of which shall be included in the Comprehensive Plan of Hernando County, Florida, and shall supersede any and all elements or portions of elements as specified in the amendment.

#### SECTION TWO. SEVERABILITY

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase of the ordinance, for any reason, is held to be unconstitutional, not found in compliance with Chapter 163, FS, void or invalid, the validity of the remaining portions of said ordinance shall not be affected thereby.

#### SECTION THREE. INCLUSION INTO THE CODE

The provisions of this ordinance shall be included and incorporated in the Code of Ordinances of Hernando County, as an addition or amendment thereto, and shall be appropriately renumbered to conform to the uniform numbering system of the Code.

#### SECTION FOUR. EFFECTIVE DATE OF PLAN AMENDMENT

The effective date of this plan amendment shall be the date a final order is issued by the Department of Community Affairs or Administration Commission finding the amendment in compliance in accordance with Section 163.3184(1)(b), Florida Statutes, whichever occurs earlier. No development orders, development permits, or land uses dependent on this amendment may be issued or commence before it has become effective. If a final order of non-compliance is issued by the Administration Commission, this amendment may nevertheless be made effective by adoption of a resolution affirming its effective status, a copy of which resolution shall be sent to the Florida Department of Community Affairs, Division of Community Planning, Plan Processing Team.

#### SECTION FIVE. EFFECTIVE DATE OF ORDINANCE

This ordinance shall become effective upon filing a certified copy of the ordinance with the Department of State within 10 days of enactment.







POLICY 10.01A(1):

Hernando County will establish and maintain an entity charged with the responsibility for economic development efforts on behalf of county government. This entity may be part of county government, private, a cooperative effort of both sectors, or some other structure, as necessary, and its responsibilities shall be as designated by the Board of County Commissioners from time to time.

POLICY 10.01A(2):

Since up to 80 percent of community economic growth is typically generated by the growth of existing businesses and the establishment of new businesses, Hernando County's Economic Development entity will have the responsibility for developing strategies to support existing businesses. Support shall consist of: communicating to identify concerns, problems, and needs; informing businesses of sources of assistance and resources; monitoring employee recruitment efforts to determine the workforce characteristics needed by local businesses; coordinating with the local workforce board; and other strategies intended to improve communications and make clear that existing businesses are valued and appreciated in Hernando County.

POLICY 10.01A(3):

New businesses will be recruited in targeted industries to improve the diversity and thereby the stability of Hernando County's economy. Recruitment will be targeted to complement and support existing businesses, to attract new business and industry with varied economic characteristics, and to recruit new businesses and industries which will not degrade Hernando County's environment.

### THE NATURAL ENVIRONMENT AS AN ECONOMIC ASSET

OBJECTIVE 10.01B: THE QUALITY OF HERNANDO COUNTY'S

POLICY 10.01E(1): The Economic Development entity of Hernando County will develop a process for identifying issues where regulatory requirements are presenting problems in conflict with economic development efforts, and for providing assistance to businesses in addressing those conflicts.

### MONITORING AND EVALUATION PROCEDURES

OBJECTIVE 10.01F:

MEASURE THE PERFORMANCE AND EFFECTIVENESS OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT EFFORTS AND THE OBJECTIVES OF THIS ELEMENT

POLICY 10.01F(1): Hernando County shall select certain economic indicators and monitor them over time as measurements of the effectiveness of Hernando County's economic development efforts and the objectives of this element.

POLICY 10.01F(2): The indicators shall be selected to focus monitoring on measurements of the industries, markets, groups, processes, entities, goals, policies, or other areas targeted by economic development activities, so that effectiveness of economic development efforts may be evaluated. Selection of the indicators shall include delineations of the time periods over which each is expected to become a valid measurement of the effectiveness of economic development activities, with the understanding that economic development efforts may require significant time periods to show measurable results.

POLICY 10.01F(3): The economic development entity shall annually report to the Local Planning Agency regarding the status of these indicators, any changes over time, and the implications for evaluating the

effectiveness of the objectives of this element. This report need not stand alone and may be combined with or incorporated into other reporting processes.
