24 25	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF

28	WHEREAS, the Board finds that "user fees" are a fairer means of paying for and funding
20 29	certain facilities and services enjoyed by some but not all residents of Hernando County; and,
30	certain facilities and services enjoyed by some but not all residents of memando County, and,
31	WHEREAS, Pine Island Beach, Rogers Park, County-operated boat ramps and certain
32	parks including the "Dog Park" are examples of facilities that should be funded in whole or part
33	through user fees and collecting parking fees at these facilities is one means of assessing and
34	collection such user fees.
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36	SECTION I. Amending Chapter 20 (Motor Vehicles and Traffic), Article III (Stopping,

1 (g) Crosswalk: 2 3 (1)That part of a roadway at an intersection included within the connections 4 of the lateral lines of the sidewalks on opposite sides of the highway, 5 measured from the curbs or, in the absence of curbs, from the edges of the 6 traversable roadway. 7 8 (2)Any portion of a roadway set aside for pedestrian crossing at an 9 intersection or elsewhere which is distinctly indicated by lines or other 10 markings on the surface. 11 12 Designated public disabled parking space: Any public disabled parking space (h)13 posted with the sign bearing the internationally accepted wheelchair symbol and the caption 14 "PARKING BY DISABLED PERMIT ONLY-" or similarly designated on the parking space. 15 Exclusive bicycle lane: That portion of a highway or street set aside only for 16 (i) 17 bicycle travel and which is distinctly indicated by lines or other markings on the surface. 18 19 (j) Handicapped or disabled person: Any person who is: 20 21 Severely physically disabled and has permanent mobility problems which (1)22 substantially impair his ability to ambulate; or 23 24 (2)Certified as legally blind. 25 26 Any person meeting either of the above requirements must also have been issued an 27 exemption entitlement parking permit pursuant to Section 320.0848 chapter 320. Florida 28 Statutes, as amended, or legally issued pursuant to the statute, rule or regulation of any other 29 country, state, province, district or territory. 30 31 *Highway*: The entire width between the boundary lines of every way or place of (k) 32 whatever nature when any part thereof is open to the use of the public for purposes of vehicular 33 traffic. 34 35 (l) Intersection: 36 37 (1)The area embraced within the prolongation or connection of the lateral 38 curb lines; or, if none, then the lateral boundary lines of the roadways of 39 two (2) highways which join one another at, or approximately at, right 40 angles; or the area within which vehicles traveling upon different 41 highways joining at any other angle may come in conflict. 42 43 (2)Where a highway includes two (2) roadways thirty (30) feet or more apart, 44 then every crossing of each roadway of such divided highway by an intersecting highway shall be regarded as a separate intersection. In the 45

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event such intersecting highway also includes two (2) roadways thirty (30) feet or more apart, then every crossing of two (2) roadways of such highways shall be regarded as a separate intersection.

(m) Pay designated parking space: Any parking space within any land owned, leased or controlled by the county that is marked or designated as pay parking and for which a parking fee is required to stop, stand or park any vehicle to cover the duration of time said vehicle is stopped, standing or parked in said space. The meter or pay station may be individualized to each particular parking space or may be placed in a centralized location or locations in order to cover multiple parking spaces.

(m n) Official traffic-control device: All signs, signals, markings and devices placed or erected by authority of a public body or official having jurisdiction for the purpose of regulating, warning or guiding traffic.

 $(n \ o)$ Official traffic-control signal: Any device, whether manually, electrically or mechanically operated, by which traffic is alternately directed to stop and permitted to proceed.

19 (o p) Owner: A person who holds the legal title of a vehicle, or, in the event a vehicle 20 is the subject of an agreement for the conditional sale or lease thereof with the right of purchase 21 upon performance of the conditions stated in the agreement and with an immediate right of 22 possession vested in the conditional vendee or lessee, or in the event a mortgagor of the vehicle 23 is entitled to possession, then such conditional vendee, or lessee, or mortgagor shall be deemed 24 the owner, for purposes of this article.

(p g) *Park or parking*: The standing of a vehicle, whether occupied or not, otherwise
than temporarily for the purpose of and while actually engaged in loading or unloading
merchandise or passengers as may be permitted by law under this article.

 41 said vehicle is parked, stopped or standing in violation of the terms of this article. The means by
 42 which a violation is enforced through the affixing of an official form to the vehicle. A parking
 43 ticket shall identify the vehicle by tag number or vehicle identification number, list the type of
 44 violation(s), state the amount of civil penalty, state the procedures to be followed in either paying
 45 the civil penalty or electing to have a hearing to contest the civil penalty, and state the penalty for

failure to comply with the directions contained in the ticket. The parking ticket may be in the form of a ticket, notice, or citation although for purposes of this article all may be treated as one and the same.

(st) Person: Any natural person, firm, copartnership, association or corporation.

 $(\underline{u} \underline{v})$ Public parking space: Any parking space which the owner, lessee or person in control of such property provides for use by members of the public other than employees of such owner, lessee or person, including, but not limited to, parking spaces at shopping centers, stores, offices, motels, malls, restaurants and marinas.

 $(\mathbf{v} \mathbf{w})$ Railroad: A carrier of persons or property upon cars operated upon stationary rails.

(<u>w x</u>) *Residential area*: Any area of the county which is classified within any one of the following zoning classifications: R-1A, R-1B, R-1C, R-2, R-3, R-PDP, RM or MH-PDP.

(x y) *Roadway*: That portion of a highway improved, designed or ordinarily used for 22 vehicular travel, exclusive of berm or shoulder. In the event a highway includes two (2) or more 23 separate roadways, the term "roadway," as used herein, shall refer to any such roadway 24 separately, but not to all such roadways collectively.

42 (a) No person shall park a vehicle, watercraft or trailer any place on park property
 43 other than in the regular designated facilities provided for that particular type of vehicle or
 44 vehicle and trailer, unless directed otherwise by law enforcement officers or park employees.

(b) No person shall park or station any vehicle in any zone designated and marked "no parking," or otherwise marked for restricted use.

(c) No person shall double park any vehicle at any time on any road or park area, unless so directed by a law enforcement officer or park employee.

(d) Any person parking in a pay designated parking space shall pay all parking fees required to cover the duration of time said vehicle is stopped, standing or parked in said space unless exempted under section 20-41 of this code.

(e) <u>A violation of this section may be enforced as provided in Chapter 20, Article III</u> (Stopping, Standing and Parking) of this code.

SECTION III. Severability. It is declared to be the intent of the Board of County
 Commissioners that if any section, subsection, clause, sentence, phrase, or provision of this
 ordinance is for any reason held unconstitutional or invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect
 the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.

SECTION IV. Repeal of Conflicting Ordinances. The provisions of any other Hernando county ordinance that are inconsistent or in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are repealed to the extent of such inconsistency or conflict.

SECTION V. Inclusion in the Code. It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners of Hernando County, Florida, and it is hereby provided, that the provisions of this Ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of Hernando County, Florida. To this end, any section or subsection of this Ordinance may be renumbered or relettered to accomplish such intention, and the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section, "article," or other appropriate designation.

SECTION VI. Effective date. This ordinance shall take effect immediately and shall be filed with the Department of State.
