AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 7 (BOATS AND WATERWAYS), ARTICLE II (BOATING REGULATIONS) OF THE HERNANDO COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES BY AMENDING THE VARIOUS CODE SECTIONS THEREIN; PROVIDING FOR ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS, ENFORCEMENT AND PENALTIES; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR INCLUSION IN THE CODE; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF INCONSISTENT PROVISIONS; PROVIDING FOR A FINDING AND DECLARATION OF EMERGENCY; PROVIDING FOR SERVING A COPY TO THE FLORIDA FISH AND WILDLIFE COMMISSION; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the County desires to update and amend certain provisions of Chapter 7, Article II of the Hernando County Code of Ordinances relating to boating regulations and to provide for additional regulations, penalties and as provided for herein.

NOW THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF HERNANDO COUNTY, FLORIDA:

SECTION I. AMENDING CHAPTER 7 (BOATS AND WATERWAYS), ARTICLE II (BOATING **REGULATIONS).** Chapter 7 (Boats and Waterways), Article II (Boating Regulations) is amended to read as follows, with underlined matter added and struck-through matter deleted:

ARTICLE II. BOATING REGULATIONS

Sec. 7-16. Findings.

The board of county commissioners hereby makes the following findings of fact:

(1) There exists extreme safety hazards on portions of the The Weeki Wachee River, Withlacoochee River, Hernando Beach Channel, Bayport Channel, tributaries and canals connecting thereto and all other navigable waterways, lakes and water bodies of Hernando County which within the county are used by the public for public bathing, pleasure boating and fishing by children and adults any recreation including, without limitation, boating, fishing, swimming, bathing, commerce and transportation.

- The hazards result from the operation of watercraft vessel such as boats (regardless of propulsion method), jet skis and airboats whether driven by outboard or inboard motor(s) or jet drive driven at high rates of excessive speed, or driven in such a fashion manner as to create a substantial wake where wake is prohibited or create excess wake where wake required to be minimized, or driven in a careless fashion, reckless or intentionally dangerous manner, or driven within any prohibited or restricted area causes public safety concerns and is otherwise contrary to the health, safety and welfare of the public at large.
- (3) The health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the county and of all persons using or living along <u>or near</u> the Weeki Wachee River, Withlacoochee River, <u>Hernando Beach Channel</u>, <u>Bayport Channel</u>, <u>canals</u>, <u>tributaries connecting to any of the foregoing</u>, and all other waterways, <u>lakes and water bodies</u> of the county is <u>are</u> jeopardized unless the use <u>of such watercraft</u> <u>and operation of vessels</u> is <u>are</u> regulated.

Sec. 7-17. Restricted speed zones; authority to designate. Definitions.

The following definitions shall apply to this article.

Airboat means a watercraft which has a principle propulsion system which utilizes a pusher-type or tractor-type propeller, fan or blade which is not normally submerged below the water surface upon which the watercraft operates; the fact an airboat can be propelled by a small auxiliary motor or by some other force does not change its characterization as an airboat.

Bayport Seagrass Protection Zones shall refer to those submerged lands lying westward of Weeki Wachee/Bayport/Pine Island Drive, as generally delineated on Appendix Map B-1 [attached to Ordinance No. 2009-07], (incorporated herein by reference and made a part hereof), designated to protect seagrasses from propeller scarring and to encourage seagrass regeneration. The actual delineation of these zones shall be by signage at appropriate points around the perimeter of each zone. Watercraft shall use caution in the Bayport Seagrass Protection Zones and shall operate in a manner not to destroy or damage seagrasses.

<u>Dredge boat</u> means any boat or barge which contains, holds, carries or floats equipment or machinery of any size or type for the purpose of dredging or removing rock or sand from any channel, tributary, canal, waterway or water body within the boundary or under the jurisdiction or control of the county and which includes, without limitation, the Hernando Beach Channel and the Bayport Channel.

Existing natural waterway shall mean an area of navigable water that is naturally created and unaltered. This definition specifically excludes any and all man made trails, without regard to the length of their existence or reason for their creation.

 Flood stage (as to the Withlacoochee River) means that period of time commencing when the waters of the Withlacoochee River reach flood stage, as set from time to time by either the federal government or the State of Florida, and ending when the Withlacoochee River crests, as determined by the same governmental body.

<u>Idle speed</u> means that a watercraft operating within any such area must be throttled down to the point where the engine is just above a stall. At idle speed, a watercraft should cast little or no wake.

Jumping of roadways shall mean the propulsion of a watercraft onto or over any roadway.

No entry zone means an area where no vessel of any kind shall be permitted within the designated area.

Operation means to have actual control and/or the ability to have control of the vessel, whether moving or not, whether the engines are powered or running, or not.

Person means any person, firm, corporation, public agency or legal entity.

<u>Seagrasses</u> shall refer to all underwater and aquatic grasses, grass beds and grass bed communities and shall have the same meaning as the terms "seagrasses" and "seagrass beds" are used within Chapter 62 of the Florida Administrative Code.

<u>Seagrass regeneration special protection zones</u> shall refer to those marsh and coastal areas lying westward of Hernando Beach but excluding the Bayport Seagrass Protection Zones (as separately defined), as generally delineated on Appendix Map A [attached to Ordinance No. 2008-22] (incorporated herein by reference and made a part hereof), designated to protect seagrasses and environmentally sensitive zones. The actual delineation of these zones shall be by signage at appropriate points around the perimeter of each zone.

Slow speed/minimum wake zone means that a vessel operating within any such area must be fully off plane and completely settled into the water. It may not proceed at a speed greater than that speed which is reasonable and prudent to avoid the creation of an excessive wake or other hazardous condition under the existing circumstances.

<u>Trail</u> means any defined area where continuous previous usage by vessels is evident by propeller-created trenches or bottom scarring.

<u>Vessel</u> means any type of boat or floating craft and includes all watercraft.

Watercraft means any type of boat or floating craft which is propelled or powered by an engine or motor. Examples of watercraft include, without limitation, ships, yachts, motorboats, tugboats, jet skis, airboats, hovercrafts, hydrofoils, seaplanes, and sailboats containing any motorized drive or propeller. Watercraft does not include any type of boat or floating craft powered solely by sail, wind, or human paddle or stroking.

<u>Withlacoochee River</u> means all portions of the Withlacoochee River, its tributaries and their overflow within Hernando County, except those portions of the Withlacoochee River between the point where the Withlacoochee River first enters the Withlacoochee State Forest and Alligator Point.

(a) Designation of restricted speed zones. The board of county commissioners is hereby authorized to designate areas within navigable waters of the county, including the Hernando Beach Channel and the Bayport Channel as restricted zones, either as a "Slow Down-Minimum Wake" zone or as an "Idle Speed-No Wake" zone. Such designation shall not take effect until there has been one publication in a local newspaper of general circulation in the county, in which the area designated as the restricted zone is defined and the type of zone indicated. No area shall be designated as either type of restricted zone unless a public hearing is first held by the board of county commissioners, after due notice is published at which all interested persons shall be heard. Any amendment to this article which has been duly advertised in accordance with s. 125.66, Florida Statutes, and a public hearing by the board of county commissioners has been held shall be deemed to satisfy all of the foregoing advertising and notice requirements. Violations of this provision and of the restrictions in the restricted zone shall constitute a violation of this article. Any area designated as a "Slow Down-Minimum Wake" zone or as an "Idle Speed-No Wake" zone shall be posted by the county with signs clearly marking the areas designated. The county port authority shall be advised of any such proposed designation, and the board of county commissioners may consider any comments or recommendations of the authority pertaining thereto.

(b) <u>Mandatory "Idle Speed–No Wake" zone around dredge boats</u>. The operation, moving or parking of any dredge boat within any waterway or water body covered under this article shall be deemed to constitute a navigational and safety hazard. There shall be a three hundred feet (300') "Idle Speed–No Wake" around any dredge boat which is operating, moving or parked in connection with any dredging operation. A violation of this provision shall carry the severest fine/penalty allowed by law upon plea or finding of guilt.

Any area designated as a "Slow Down-Minimum Wake" zone or as an "Idle Speed-No Wake" zone shall be posted by the county with signs clearly marking the areas designated. The county waterways division, the county code enforcement division, and the county sheriff's office are empowered to post such additional signage within or along any waterway or water body covered under this article necessary to effectuate or enforce any provision herein.

Sec. 7-18 7-20. Operation of all vessels in safe manner required; violations.

- (a) All watercraft vessels being operated in the navigable waters any waterways or water body of the county shall be operated in a safe manner. No persons shall operate a watercraft any vessel in a dangerous, or reckless or careless manner so as to endanger the safety or welfare of any person or any person's property.
- (b) No person shall operate any vessel at such a speed so as to cause a wake of such magnitude as to endanger the safety of any swimmer or diver, or as to endanger any other vessel (whether underway, anchored, or secured to a dock, seawall or other mooring device), or as to cause damage to any dock, seawall or mooring device, or as to cause damage to public or private property, or to cause appreciable erosion to any bank or shoreline.
 - (c) No person shall operate any vessel in excess of any posted speed limit.
- (d) No person shall operate any vessel in any no entry zone or in any restricted area in violation of said restriction.
- (e) No person shall operate any watercraft within any seagrass regeneration special protection zone.
- (f) No person shall operate any vessel as to cause wake in any designated "Idle Speed—No Wake" zone which has been duly posted with appropriate signage or within 300' of any dredge boat. A dredge boat shall have appropriate "Idle Speed—No Wake" signage posted if it is not plainly visible with the naked eye that the vessel is a dredge boat.
- (g) No person shall operate any vessel as to cause excessive wake in any designated "Slow Down–Minimum Wake" zone which has been duly posted with appropriate signage.
- (h) No person may intentionally navigate any vessel across any dredge pipe or dredge piping which is floating on the surface and plainly visible with the naked eye during daylight hours or which pipe or piping can reasonably be seen floating with the use of a spotlight as to vessels operating between dusk and dawn. Any person operating a vessel fast enough to create a noticeable or excessive wake, or is operating the vessel in a dangerous, reckless or careless manner, or is operating the vessel within any seagrass regeneration special protection zone, or is operating the vessel outside of any channel, canal or tributary containing navigation markings, then the operator of said shall vessel be "presumed" to have been acting *intentionally* for purposes of this provision. This presumption may only be rebutted (overturned) by the operator demonstrating to the trier of fact, by clear and convincing evidence, that the operator was not acting intentionally.
 - (i) No person shall operate a vessel in violation of chapter 327 or 328, Florida Statutes.
- (bj) No person shall operate a watercraft or <u>any</u> vessel in violation <u>of any provision</u> of this article or <u>of any provision</u> of article IV of this chapter.

The penalties set forth in Code Sec. 7-23 herein may be imposed upon any plea or finding of guilt that a violation of any of the foregoing has occurred. Each violation shall constitute a separate offense.

No watercraft shall be operated in the navigable waters of the county at such a speed so as to cause a wake of such magnitude as to endanger the safety of any swimmer or diver or as to endanger any other watercraft, whether anchored, secured to a dock or underway. No watercraft shall be operated at such a speed so as to cause a wake of such magnitude as to cause danger to any dock, or any other public or private property, or cause appreciable erosion to the banks of any navigable waterway.

All law enforcement officers as defined under existing or future Florida Statutes, including but not limited to the sheriff of the county and his duly authorized deputies, officers of the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission, and officers of the Florida Marine Patrol, and the are hereby authorized to enforce the provisions of this article and article IV of this chapter.

The county may establish and post areas to prohibit or restrict entry, limit speed, or (a) otherwise regulate vessels operating in any waters within the boundaries of the county as necessary to effectuate or enforce this article.

The prohibitions and restrictions contained in this article shall not apply to any vessel owned or under contract to any federal, state or local law enforcement authority operated by sworn law enforcement officer(s) acting in their official capacity or to any fire/rescue boat responding to an emergency.

The provisions of this article shall be enforced by members of all duly authorized (c) federal, state, county and municipal law enforcement agencies within the county including, but not limited to, all sworn law enforcement officers employed by or under the county sheriff, all sworn law enforcement officers of the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission, all sworn law enforcement officers of the Florida Marine Patrol, and all sworn law enforcement officers of any other state or federal agency having jurisdiction in these waters.

Sec. 7-21 7-22. Watercraft Vessels on Withlacoochee River-Operation at certain times prohibited.

- (a) Legislative findings. The recitation of the following findings is hereby incorporated as findings of fact by the Hernando County Board of County Commissioners:
 - (1) Severe flooding conditions develop along the Withlacoochee River as a result of heavy rains from time to time;
 - (2) The Withlacoochee River then overflows its banks and floods adjacent property, causing property damage and otherwise threatening the health, safety and welfare of the residents of Hernando County;
 - (3) Such catastrophic conditions result in the development of health and safety hazards to residents of Hernando County along the Withlacoochee River; and
 - (4) The use of watercraft vessel, boat craft, canoes, rafts, motorized boat craft or any type of flotation device on the Withlacoochee River and on the waters overflowing the Withlacoochee River other than for law enforcement, evacuation and emergency purposes constitutes a hindrance to the implementation of emergency preparedness plans of Hernando County and threatens the protection of the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the county.
 - (b) Definitions. The following definitions shall apply to this section.
 - (1) Flood stage. That period of time commencing when the waters of the Withlacoochee River reach flood stage, as set from time to time by either the federal government or the State of Florida at the Trilby gauge, and ending when the Withlacoochee River crests, as determined by either the federal government or the State of Florida at the Holder gauge.
 - (2) Watercraft. Any type of flotation device of any nature or kind, including, but not limited to, boats, rafts, tubes, canoes, motorized boat craft, sailboats, submarines, air boats, hovercraft, hydrofoils, jet skis, jet boats, wet bikes, surfboards and wind-surfboards.
 - (3) Withlacoochee River. All portions of the Withlacoochee River, its tributaries and their overflow within Hernando County, except those portions of the Withlacoochee River between the point where the Withlacoochee River first enters the Withlacoochee State Forest and Alligator Point.
- (c) (b) Operation of watercraft vessels prohibited. The operation or utilization of watercraft vessels on the Withlacoochee River is prohibited during flood stage. (d) Exceptions. Paragraph (e) above This provision shall not apply to the operation or utilization of watercraft vessels on the

43 44 45 Withlacoochee River during flood stage by law enforcement officers or other government officials or employees or the operation or utilization of watercraft vessels by others as authorized or directed by such officers, officials or employees for evacuation or emergency purposes.

Penalties. Any violation of this section shall constitute a misdemeanor and shall be punished as provided by law for violations of county ordinances.

Sec. 7-23. Penalties.

- (a) Pursuant to s. 125.69, Florida Statutes, any person or persons, firm or corporation, or any agent thereof who violates any provision of this section shall be subject to prosecution in the name of the state in the same manner as misdemeanors are prosecuted; and, upon conviction such person shall be punished by a fine not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500.00) or by imprisonment in the county jail not to exceed sixty (60) days or by both such fine and imprisonment. Each incident or separate occurrence of an act that violates this article shall be deemed a separate offense.
- (b) Any person or persons, firm or corporation, or any agent thereof who violates any provision of this section may be prosecuted in the manner provided for in chanter 2, Article III, of the Hernando County Code of Ordinances.
- The remedies and penalties herein are not intended to be cumulative and the county (c) or any law enforcement officer or agency having jurisdiction may institute any appropriate action or proceedings to prevent, restrain, enjoin, correct, abate, penalize or fine any violation of this article.
- Any combination of the foregoing. (d)

Sec. 7-24. Allocation of Fines, Penalties and Forfeitures.

For all enforcement actions initiated by any sworn law enforcement officer under the county sheriff and prosecuted by or in the name of the sheriff or the State of Florida, then all fines, penalties and forfeitures assessed by the court or recovered shall be retained by the sheriff except as otherwise required to be shared with, or turned over to, the State of Florida. For all enforcement actions initiated by the Florida Fish and Wildlife Commission or the Florida Marine Patrol and prosecuted by or in the name of the respective state agency or the State of Florida, then all fines, penalties and forfeitures assessed by the court or recovered shall be retained by the respective initiating state agency except as otherwise required to be shared with, or turned over to, the State of Florida. For

all enforcement actions initiated and prosecuted by or in the name of the county, then all fines,

penalties and forfeitures assessed by the court or recovered shall be retained by the county except

as otherwise required to be shared with, or turned over to, the State of Florida.

Secs. 7-22 7-25-7-50. Reserved.

SECTION II. SEVERABILITY. It is declared to be the intent of the Board of County Commissioners that if any section, subsection, clause, sentence, phrase, or provision of this ordinance is for any reason held unconstitutional or invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.

SECTION III. INCLUSION IN THE CODE. It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners of Hernando County, Florida, and it is hereby provided, that the provisions of this Ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of Hernando County, Florida. To this end, any section or subsection of this Ordinance may be renumbered or relettered to accomplish such intention, and the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section, "article," or other appropriate designation.

SECTION IV. REPEAL OF CONFLICTING ORDINANCES. The provisions of any other Hernando County ordinance that are inconsistent or in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are repealed to the extent of such inconsistency or conflict.

SECTION V. DECLARATION OF EMERGENCY. The Board of County Commissioners of Hernando County, Florida hereby finds and declares that an emergency exists which requires that this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon adoption because the county is currently in the process of dredging the Hernando Beach Channel, that the existing dredge boat and dredge pipes and piping present navigational and safety hazards, and that any delay in implementing this Ordinance would delay making the Hernando Beach Channel safer and, thereby, potentially preventing or minimizing future boating-related injuries and damages.

SECTION VI. FILING WITH FLORIDA FISH AND WILDLIFE COMMISSION. Upon its adoption, a true copy of this Ordinance shall be sent to the Florida Fish and Wildlife Commission.

SECTION VII. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Department of State.
