## ORDINANCE NO.: 2016-/3 1 2 AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY 3 COMMISSIONERS OF HERNANDO COUNTY. FLORIDA. PERTAINING ΤO ANIMAL CARE AND ADOPTION: 4 AMENDING THE DEFINITION OF TETHER; SPECIFICALLY 5 LIMITING THE REGULATION OF TETHERING TO DOGS 6 AND CATS: PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY: PROVIDING 7 8 FOR INCLUSION IN THE CODE; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF INCONSISTENT PROVISIONS: AND PROVIDING FOR AN 9 EFFECTIVE DATE. 10 11 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY 12 **COMMISSIONERS OF HERNANDO COUNTY:** 13 14 Section 6-2 is hereby amended as follows: 1. 15 a. Definition of Tether. 16 Tether means to restrain an animal a dog or a cat by tying the animal dog or cat to any 17 object or structure, including without limitation a house, tree, fence, post, garage, or shed, 18 by any means, including without limitation a chain, rope, cord, leash, or running line. 19 Tethering shall not include using a leash or lead to walk an animal a dog or cat. Notwithstanding the foregoing, an animal a dog or cat may be tethered while actively 20 21 participating in or attending an organized show, field trial, agility event, herding contest or 22 other similar exposition or event, of a limited duration, that involves the judging or 23 evaluation of animals a dog or cat. Tethering regulations only apply to dogs or cats. 24 b. The definition for Enclosure is hereby re-defined as: 25 Enclosure is any place where any animal dog or cat is maintained outdoors including but is not 26 limited to a fenced yard, kennel, or run and the animal dog or cat shall be provided proper shelter 27 within such enclosed area. The enclosure shall be suitable to prevent the escape of the animal 28 dog or cat or the entry of young children. The enclosed area shall be large enough for the

1 animal's dog's or the cat's size and temperament, considering the number of animals dogs or cats 2 that may be using the enclosure at any given time. For dogs, the enclosure shall be large enough 3 for each dog to achieve a running stride. It shall include a shaded area, either by natural or 4 artificial means that is large enough during all hours to shade all animals dogs or cats in the 5 enclosure without crowding. The enclosure and surrounding area shall be free from trash, 6 standing water, and cleaned regularly to remove accumulated waste and debris, parasites, 7 including fleas, ticks and rodents so as not to threaten the physical wellbeing of the animal dog 8 or cat. Each animal dog or cat housed in the primary enclosure, shall be provided wholesome 9 food and a continuous supply of visibly clean, fresh water provided in a sanitary manner and in a 10 container sized appropriately for the dog's or the cat's animal's species and size.

## 12 c. The definition for Shelter is hereby re-defined as:

13 Shelter shall include but is not limited to a permanent structure with four sides, a solid roof, 14 and a solid bottom. Any structure in which an animal a dog or a cat is housed must be 15 well ventilated with fresh air by means of windows, doors, vents, or fans. The structure shall protect the animal dog or cat from injury. The shelter shall have an entryway that 16 17 the animal dog or cat can easily enter and exit in a natural manner and protects the animal dog or cat from exposure to the elements. The structure shall be weather proof and 18 19 structurally sound, with insulation appropriate to local climatic conditions and sufficient to 20 protect each animal dog or cat from inclement weather; the direct rays of the sun, wind, 21 and rain; be constructed to allow each sheltered animal dog or cat freedom of movement 22 to make normal postural adjustments, including the ability to stand up, turn around and lie 23 down with its limbs outstretched in a normal posture. The animal dog or cat shall be

1	provided clean, dry bedding, or shall have a clean, solid resting place that is appropriate
2	for the animal's dog's or the cat's size, age, health, and physical condition. The shelter
3	shall be properly lighted to provide a regular lighting cycle of either natural or artificial
4	light corresponding to the natural periods of daylight unless otherwise directed by a
5	licensed veterinarian. Structures with wire, grid, or slat floors which permit the animal's
6	dog's or the cat's feet to pass through openings, sag under the animal's dog's or the cat's
7	weight or which otherwise do not protect the animal's dog's or the cat's feet or toes from
8	injury are prohibited. Examples of inadequate shelter include, but are not limited to, lean-
9	tos, metal drums, wire or airline carrier crates, cardboard boxes, abandoned vehicles,
10	porches, decks, or material that does not provide sufficient protection from the elements.
11	2. Section 6-34 - Regulation of Tethering is hereby amended as follows:
12	In order to protect the public safety and welfare, the following conditions shall apply when
13	tethering an animal a dog or cat.
14	A. No person, to include owner, harborer, or caretaker shall tether an animal a dog or
15	cat to a stationary or inanimate object as a means of confinement or restraint unless
16	such person is with the animal dog or cat and the animal dog or cat is at all times
17	visible to such person.
18	B. The tether must be constructed of material sufficient to restrain the animal dog or
19	cat but may not place the animal dog or cat in danger of injury or death. At no time shall

20 the tether extend over an object or edge in such a manner that could result in strangulation,

entanglement of or injury to the animal dog or cat. Logging chains and vehicle tow chains
 may not be used to tether an animal a dog or cat. The addition of weight to an animal's a
 dog or cat's collar, harness, chain, or tether is prohibited.

C. The tether shall be of a length and weight to allow an animal <u>a dog or cat</u> to move
at least ten feet in all directions from the point of tethering and allow entry and egress to
proper shelter and enclosure as defined herein. No person shall keep an animal <u>a dog or</u>
cat in any enclosure without daily exercise and change of air.

8 D. The tether shall be attached to a properly fitted buckle-style collar or buckle-style 9 harness sufficient to restrain the animal dog or cat. The tether must have an operative swivel 10 attached to a collar or harness and may not be attached to a stationary object at a height 11 higher than the animal's dog or cat's neck in standing position. The tether must swivel on 12 both ends and be free of tangles. A leash or lead may not be attached directly to the 13 animal's dog or cat's neck in lieu of a manufactured collar or harness. Choke, chain, slip, 14 or prong type collars shall not be used on an animal a dog or cat when such animal dog or 15 cat is tethered.

E. The animal dog or cat must have access to sufficient wholesome food and a continuous supply of clean, potable water, and freedom to move about and avoid area of animal dog's or cat's waste, parasites, or anything that would adversely harm an animal's a dog's or a cat's health or safety.

F. The tethered animal dog or cat must be at least six months of age and may not

1 be sick or injured.

G. The animal dog or cat may not be outside during extreme weather conditions,
including, but not limited to, extreme heat or near-freezing temperatures or during
thunderstorms, lightning storms, tornado watches or warnings, or during tropical storm or
hurricane watches or warnings.

H. No tether may extend any closer than six feet from the perimeter fence or lot
line. If it is connected to a pulley, the running line must be at least 15 feet in length and
less than seven feet above the ground. If multiple dogs or cats, they must be tethered
separately with no sharing of running lines, or near enough to each other that they may
become tangled. No animal dog or cat shall be tethered so that it has access to public
property, including easements, and rights of way property, or the property of another.

I. When the animal dog or cat is transported in a pickup truck with a metal bed, the animal dog or cat shall be provided protection from the metal bed; and, the dog shall be safely and properly tethered as defined herein. Any cat being transported must be in a hard shelled crate specifically designed for cats and the crate must be secured to the truck bed so that it does not move during transporting.

J. Tethering and/or inappropriately sheltering an animal <u>a dog or cat</u> in violation
of the provisions of this section shall be unlawful and a Class V violation of this Chapter.
When a violation of this section occurs, an officer may take reasonable measures to remove
the animal dog or cat from the tether and/or inappropriate shelter and impound the animal

1 <u>dog or cat.</u>

2 K. "Inadequate shelter" may be indicated by the appearance of the shelter itself, 3 including but not limited to, size, structural soundness, evidence of crowding within the 4 housing facility, unhealthy environment in the area immediately surrounding such facility, 5 or by the appearance or physical condition of the animal dog or the cat. 6 L. Upon enactment of this ordinance, officers shall provide a warning to all first-7 time tethering and/or sheltering violators and allow 5 working days to correct the violation 8 before any civil citation is issued. Notwithstanding the foregoing, nothing shall prevent an 9 officer from citing an owner for violation of any other provision of this ordinance, 10 including other prohibited acts of cruelty or neglect. 11 M. All persons, to include, owners, harborers, and caretakers of animals a dog or cat shall provide all health related grooming, cleaning, and parasite control required to 12 13 ensure that the animals dogs or cats are maintained in a humane state and able to carry out 14 normal activities. 15 N. No animal dog or cat shall be tethered on vacant or abandoned property. 16 3 Section - Severability. It is declared to be the intent of the Board of County 17 Commissioners that if any section, subsection, clause, sentence, phrase, or provision of this 18 ordinance is for any reason held unconstitutional or invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not

affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.

1	Commissioners of Hernando County, Florida, and it is hereby provided, that the provisions

4	to accomplish such intention, and that the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section,
5	"article," or other appropriate designation.
6	5. Section - Conflicting Provisions Repealed. All ordinances or parts of ordinances
7	in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.
8	6. Section - Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon
9	receipt of official acknowledgment from the office of the Secretary of State of Florida that
10	this ordinance has been filed with said office.
