ORDINANCE NO.: 2021- \ \ 5 1 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING APPENDIX A, ARTICLE III (SPECIFIC 2 REGULATIONS), SECTION 3 (SPECIFIC USE REGULATIONS) OF THE 3 HERNANDO COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES REGARDING HOME 4 OCCUPATIONS AND LIMITED BUSINESS ACTIVITIES BY EXCEPTION 5 (HOME OCCUPATION); PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING 6 FOR INCLUSION IN THE CODE; PROVIDING FOR THE REPEAL OF 7 CONFLICTING PROVISIONS; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE. 8 9 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF 10 **HERNANDO COUNTY:** 11 Section 1. Modification of Appendix A, Article III, Section 3 of the Hernando County 12 13 Code of Ordinances. Appendix A, Article III (Specific Regulations), Section 3 (Specific Use Regulations) of the Hernando County Code, is hereby amended as follows with underlined 14

L. Home occupations. Home occupations are permitted "by right" or "by exception" in accordance with subsections 1. and 2. below. The intent of these requirements is to provide for certain types of home based businesses in residential, rural and agricultural-residential zoning categories subject to performance standards that ensure the home based businesses are incidental to the use of the premise as a residence, are compatible with residential uses, limited in scale and intensity, and do not detract from the residential character of the area.

verbiage added and stricken language deleted:

- 22 1. (*Limited business activities by right*). Limited business activities in a dwelling unit are permitted, by right, in the residential, rural and agricultural-residential zoning categories, subject to compliance with all of the following criteria and standards:
- 25 (a) Such business activities are incidental and subordinate to the principal residential use of 26 the premises and the home occupation will not change the principal character of the site as a 27 residence. There will be no change in the structural integrity (exterior appearance) of the 28 structure from that permitted by the rules of the district.

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- 1 (b) Such activities shall occupy no more than twenty-five percent (25%) of the total habitable
- 2 floor area of the residence. Note: Use of more than ten percent (10%) of the total habitable floor
- 3 area-may trigger additional building code requirements, including permits; contact the Building
- 4 Department should be consulted. The activities shall comply with any relevant local, state and
- 5 federal regulations with respect to the use, storage or disposal of any corrosive, combustible or
- 6 other hazardous or flammable or liquids.
- 7 (c) The home occupation shall be conducted entirely within the residence or entirely within
- 8 an accessory structure. The activities of the limited business activity are secondary to the use of
- 9 the property as a residence. Retail transactions may only be conducted within the residence.
- 10 (d) There is no outside appearance of the limited business activity, including signage and
- signs on vehicles. Vehicles and trailers used in connection with the business activity must be
- parked in legal parking spaces that are not located in the right of way, on or over a sidewalk, or
- on any unimproved surfaces at the residence.
- 14 (e) No advertising will contain the physical address of the home occupation location,
- 15 including signs on vehicles.
- 16 (f e) No employees, or customers, other than residents of the home, will go to or from the
- 17 residence, other than private tutoring or lessons. Employees of the Home Occupation must also
- reside in the residential dwelling, except that a total of two employees or independent contractors
- who do not reside in the residence may work at the Home Occupation. The Home Occupation
- 20 may have additional remote employees that do not work at the residential dwelling.
- 21 (g f) Vehicular traffic will be consistent with normal traffic generated within the zoning
- 22 category.
- 23 (h-g) Noise will be consistent with that volume of noise normally generated by a residence in
- 24 the applicable zoning category and noise shall not be attributed to the limited business activity.
- 25 (i-h) There will be no visible storage of any business related materials, commercial vehicles,
- or equipment associated with the limited business activity. Commercial vehicles may only be
- parked or stored as provided for in Article III, Section 3.
- 28 (i) There will be no change in the structural integrity (exterior appearance) of the structure
- 29 from that permitted by the rules of the district.
- 30 (k i) The volume of delivery trucks shall not be in excess of what is normally associated with
- a residential use in a neighborhood. In no case shall trucks greater than 2 axles make deliveries
- 32 associated with the limited incidental business use.
- 33 (1) The "by right" limited business activity shall comply with all of the criteria in this section,
- and a deviation from the criteria shall require an application for, and compliance with the criteria
- 35 for a limited business activity "by exception."

- 1 2. (Limited Business Activities by exception). Limited business activities (Home
- 2 Occupation) that do not meet the requirements for limited business activities set forth in
- 3 paragraph L.1 above, may be permitted by approval of a Special Exception pursuant to Article
- 4 V, Section VIII. Hernando County Zoning Code, subject to compliance with all the following
- 5 criteria and standards:
- 6 (a) Such business activities are incidental and subordinate to the principal residential use of
- 7 the premises and the home occupation will not change the principal character of the site as a
- 8 residence. Customer traffic shall be minimal, and may only be approved by the Special Exception
- 9 Permit. There will be no change in the structural integrity (exterior appearance) of the structure
- from that permitted by the rules of the residential district.
- 11 (b) Such activities shall occupy no more than twenty-five percent (25%) of the total habitable
- 12 floor area of the residence. Note: Use of more than ten percent (10%) of the total habitable floor
- 13 area may trigger additional building code requirements, including permits; contact the Building
- 14 Department.
- 15 (e b) The Home Occupation shall be conducted entirely within the residence or entirely within
- an accessory structure unless otherwise authorized by approval of the Special Exception Permit.
- 17 (de) There is no outside appearance of the limited business activity, except that a single "on-
- site" sign shall be permitted in accordance with Section 25.5-17.
- 19 (e) No advertising will contain the physical address of the location of the Home Occupation.
- 20 including signs on vehicles.
- 21 (1) The Home Occupation involves the employment of no more than one (1) person who
- 22 does not reside at the residence.
- 23 (g d) Vehicular traffic will be consistent with normal traffic generated within the zoning
- 24 category. Parking associated with the home occupation shall only be required in accordance with
- 25 the primary use of the site as a residence where no business is conducted.
- 26 ($\frac{1}{2}$) Noise will be consistent with that volume of noise normally generated by a residence in
- 27 the applicable zoning category, and noise shall not be attributed to the limited business activity.
- There will be no visible storage of any business related materials, commercial vehicles,
- 29 or equipment unless specific authorization is granted by approval of the Special Exception
- 30 Permit. Commercial vehicles may only be parked or stored as provided for in Article III, Section
- 31 3.
- 32 (j) There will be no change in the structural integrity (exterior appearance) of the structure
- 33 from that permitted by the rules of the district.

- 1 (kg) The volume of delivery trucks shall not be in excess of what is normally associated with
- a residential use in a neighborhood. In no case shall trucks greater than 2 axles make deliveries
- 3 associated with the limited incidental business use.
- 4 (1 h) The applicant for a limited business activities "by exception" shall not transfer the permit
- 5 to another owner or lessee of the property.
- 6 (m i) The "by exception" limited business activity shall comply with all of the criteria in this
- 7 section, and a deviation from the criteria shall not be granted unless specifically authorized by
- 8 this section.
- 9 (n j) Additional performance criteria may be prescribed by the Special Exception Permit to
- 10 ensure compliance with the criteria of this section and to ensure that the "by exception" limited
- business does not impact the surrounding neighborhood.
- Section 2. Severability. It is declared to be the intent of the Board of County
- 13 Commissioners that if any section, subsection, clause, sentence, phrase, or provision of this
- ordinance is for any reason held unconstitutional or invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect
- the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.
- Section 3. Inclusion in the Code. It is the intention of the Board of County
- 17 Commissioners of Hernando County, Florida, and it is hereby provided, that the provisions of this
- Ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of Hernando County,
- 19 Florida. To this end, the sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or relettered to accomplish
- such intention, and that the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section," "article," or any other
- 21 appropriate designation.
- Section 4. Conflicting Provisions Repealed. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in
- conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.
- Section 5. Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon receipt of
- official acknowledgment from the office of the Secretary of State of Florida that this ordinance
- has been filed with said office.
