ORDINANCE NO.: 2023 - \S 1 2 AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO FLORIDA STATUTE § 316.2123, WHICH 3 ALLOWS FOR THE OPERATION OF ALL TERRAIN VEHICLES ON UNPAVED ROADWAYS UNDER SPECIFIED CIRCUMSTANCES; 4 INCORPORATING RECITALS: AMENDING SECTION 20-2 AND CREATING 5 SECTION 20-4 TO EXEMPT HERNANDO COUNTY FROM FLORIDA 6 7 STATUTE § 316.2123; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR INCLUSION IN THE CODE: PROVIDING FOR THE REPEAL OF 8 CONFLICTING PROVISIONS: AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE. 9 WHEREAS, the Florida Legislature has enacted Fla. Stat. § 316.2123 regarding the operation 10 of all terrain vehicles ("ATV's"); and, 11 WHEREAS, Fla. Stat. § 316.2123 prohibits people from driving ATV's upon public roads 12 or streets; provided, that a licensed driver, or a minor under the supervision of a licensed driver, may 13 drive an ATV during the daytime on an unpaved roadway where the posted speed limit is less than 14 15 35 miles per hour; and, WHEREAS, Fla. Stat. § 316.2123 further provides that a county may exempt itself from the 16 provision which allows for the operation of an ATV on unpaved roadways, if its governing body, 17 by majority vote following a noticed public hearing, votes to exempt the county from this provision; 18 19 and,

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Hernando County, Florida, finds that it is in the best interest of the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Hernando County, Florida to exempt Hernando County from the provision of Fla. Stat. § 316.2123 which allows for the operation of an ATV during the daytime on unpaved roadways within the County where the posted speed limit is less than 35 miles per hour. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF HERNANDO COUNTY: Section 1. Incorporation of Recitals. The above-stated recitals are hereby accepted and approved as being true and accurate, and are adopted and incorporated herein as if set out further at length. Section 2. Repealing Authorization for ATV's to Be Operated on Unpaved Roads. Hernando County Code § 20-2, "Parking, Standing or the Presence of Vehicles in, on, or upon Drainage Retention Areas, Lakes, Ponds, Utility Property or Easements Prohibited," is hereby amended to read as follows: Sec. 20-2. Parking, Standing or the Presence of Vehicles in, on, or upon Drainage Retention Areas, Lakes, Ponds, Utility Property or Easements Prohibited. Short Title. This section may be known as the Drainage Retention Areas, (a) Lakes, Ponds, Utility Easements and Property Protection Ordinance.

(b) Definitions. The following words and phrases when used in this ordinance shall have the meanings respectively ascribed to them in this section, except where the context otherwise requires:

All-Terrain Vehicle ("ATV") means any motorized off-highway or all-terrain vehicle fifty (50) inches or less in width, having a dry weight of one thousand two hundred (1.200) pounds or less, designed to travel on three (3) or more non-highway tires, manufactured for recreational use by one (1) or more persons shall have the same definition as provided for in Fla. Stat. § 316.2074(2), as it may be amended or renumbered from time to time.

Drainage Retention Area means any parcel of property generally, but not necessarily, having sloped soil sides sometimes covered by vegetation or containing water and with an arenaceous or soil bottom with inlets to deliver storm water runoff and designed for the purpose of retaining storm water runoff; or any area or parcel of property generally recognized as a drainage retention area or any property certified by the county engineer or his designee that the area is currently being used and serves the purpose of a drainage retention area.

Lake or Pond means a body of water that in its natural state is substantially at rest with a discernible shoreline regardless of the depth of the water or whether the water is navigable or whether the land surface is wholly or partly submerged or at certain periods the surface is entirely exposed to the atmosphere.

Motor Vehicle means any self-propelled vehicle including motorcycles and all terrain vehicles not operated upon rails or tracks, but not including any bicycle or moped shall have the same definition as provided for in Fla. Stat. 316.003(46), as it may be amended or renumbered from time to time.

Motorcycle means any motor vehicle having a seat or saddle for the use of the rider and designed to travel on not more than three (3) wheels in contact with the ground shall have the same definition as provided for in Fla. Stat. 316.003(47), as it may be amended or renumbered from time to time.

Vehicle means every device in. on, or upon which any person or property is or may be transported. The vehicle does not include devices used exclusively upon stationary rails or tracks shall have the same definition as provided for in Fla. Stat. 316.003(106), as it may be amended or renumbered from time to time.

(c) Presence of vehicles in, on, or upon drainage retention areas, utility property or easements. It shall be a violation of this section for any motor vehicle, including motorcycles and ATV's to be in, on, or upon any lakes, ponds, or county drainage retention areas regardless whether the drainage retention area is denoted as such by a sign or other notice. It shall further be a violation of this ordinance for any motor vehicle including recreational or camper type vehicle, motorcycles and ATV's to be in, on, or upon any right-of-way, easement, or utility property with electrical apparatus or equipment including, but not limited to electric towers, electric

transmission lines, poles, or other support structures, fans, cooling apparatus, or transformers where the utility is regulated either by the state public service commission or the natural rural utilities service. This provision also applies to areas where any utility has an easement within a right-of-way, including, but not necessarily limited to electric substations or other apparatus used for the transmission or delivering of electricity even where such equipment is isolated and stands apart. Further, it shall also be a violation of this ordinance for anyone to damage such equipment including but not limited to hurling or shooting any projectiles or missiles at any electric substation, other electrical generating equipment, or towers or by hurling other objects including, but not limited to rocks, stones, dirt, debris, or trash. ATVs may be operated upon any unpaved roadways in Hernando County where the posted speed limit is less than thirty-five (35) miles per hour:

- (d) Territorial Applicability. This section shall be applicable in all the unincorporated areas of Hernando County.
- (e) Penalties. Any violation of this section may be prosecuted as follows:
- (1) For the first violation of any provision of this section, any law enforcement officer with jurisdiction in the unincorporated areas of Hernando County, may issue a written warning.

(2) For the second violation of any provision of this section, any law enforcement officer with jurisdiction in the unincorporated areas of Hernando County, may issue a citation with a fine not to exceed fifty dollars (\$50.00).

- (3) For the third violation of any provision of this section, any law enforcement officer with jurisdiction in the unincorporated areas of Hernando County, may issue a citation for a fine not to exceed one hundred dollars (\$100.00).
- enforcement officer with jurisdiction in the unincorporated areas of Hernando County, shall issue a mandatory court appearance where the violation may be prosecuted as described in Chapter 2, Article III as amended from time to time. Each violation of this ordinance shall be deemed a separate offense and a separate offense shall be deemed committed on each day during or on which a violation occurs or continues. In assessing fines hereunder, the special master may consider whether the violator has been convicted of or pleaded guilty to prior violations of this section.
- (5) Notwithstanding the above, a law enforcement officer in his or her own discretion in light of the circumstances, including their experience as law enforcement officers, the number of people observed violating the ordinance, potential damage to public or private property or other activities occurring in the area may arrest an individual even for a first offense and prosecute them pursuant to the provisions of subsection (e)(4) of this section.

Section 3. Prohibiting the Operation of ATV's on County Roads. A new Hernando County Code Section 20-4, to be entitled "Operation of All Terrain Vehicles on Unpaved Roadways," is hereby enacted to read as follows: Sec. 20-4. Operation of All Terrain Vehicles on Unpaved Roadways. Exemption, Pursuant to Fla. Stat. § 316.2123(2), Hernando County shall be (a) exempt from the provision of Fla. Stat. § 316.2123(1) which would otherwise allow the operation of an all terrain vehicle ("ATV") during the daytime on an unpayed roadway where the posted speed limit is less than 35 miles per hour by a licensed driver or by a minor under the supervision of a licensed driver. The term "ATV" shall have the same definition as provided for in Fla. Stat. § 316.2074(2), as it may be amended or renumbered from time to time. Territory Embraced. Pursuant to Fla. Stat. § 316.2123(2), this section shall (b) apply to both the incorporated and unincorporated areas of the county. Section 4. Severability. It is declared to be the intent of the Board of County Commissioners that if any section, subsection, clause, sentence, phrase, or provision of this ordinance is for any reason held unconstitutional or invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance. Section 5. Inclusion in the Code. It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners of Hernando County, Florida, and it is hereby provided, that the provisions of this Ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of Hernando County, Florida.
