2	AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 7 (BOATS AND WATERWAYS),
3	ARTICLE IV (PROTECTION OF AQUATIC MARSHES AND GRASSES), OF THE
4	HERNANDO COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES TO INCORPORATE SECTIONS
5	327.65(2)(a) AND (b), FLORIDA STATUTES (2023), REGARDING NOISE
6	POLLUTION FROM VESSELS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING
7	FOR INCLUSION IN THE CODE; PROVIDING FOR THE REPEAL OF
8	CONFLICTING PROVISIONS; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.
9	WHEREAS, Florida law limits local regulation of engine and exhaust noise of vessels to only
10	the parameters of sections 327.65(2)(a) and (b), Florida Statutes (2023), and
11	WHEREAS, the County desires to update and amend certain provisions of Chapter 7, Article
12	IV, of the Hernando County Code of Ordinances ("Code") to limit noise pollution from vessels
13	operating on the waters of this state within the jurisdictional boundaries of Hernando County, and to
14	enforce sound level limits and the testing of sound levels within the parameters of Florida law.
15	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY
16	COMMISSIONERS OF HERNANDO COUNTY:
17	Section 1. Amending Chapter 7 (Boats and Waterways), Article IV (Protection of Aquatic
18	Marshes and Grasses). Sections 7-72 (Definitions) and 7-73 (Operation of vessels, watercraft and
19	airboats; prohibited conduct), Chapter 7 (Boats and Waterways), Article IV (Protection of Aquatic
20	Marshes and Grasses), are amended to read as follows, with underlined matter added and

- 1 struck-through matter deleted:
- 2 Sec. 7-72. Definitions.
- 3 The following definitions shall apply to this article:

Airboat means a watercraft which has a principle propulsion system which utilizes a
 pusher-type or tractor-type propeller, fan or blade which is not normally submerged below the
 water surface upon which the watercraft operates; the fact an airboat can be propelled by a
 small auxiliary motor or by some other force does not change its characterization as an airboat.

Bayport Seagrass Protection Zones shall refer to those submerged lands lying westward 8 9 of Weeki Wachee/Bayport/Pine Island Drive, as generally delineated on appendix map B-1 [attached to Ordinance No. 2009-07], (incorporated herein by reference and made a part 10 hereof), designated to protect seagrasses from propeller scarring and to encourage seagrass 11 regeneration. The actual delineation of these zones shall be by signage at appropriate points 12 13 around the perimeter of each zone. The signage shall conform to attachment B incorporated herein by reference and made a part hereof. Additional signage (in conformance with 14 attachment C incorporated herein by reference and made a part hereof) shall be installed in 15 conspicuous locations at the boat ramps, public docks and public launching areas which serve 16 the Bayport and Jenkins Creek area. Watercraft shall use caution in the Bayport Seagrass 17 Protection Zones and shall operate in a manner not to destroy or damage seagrasses. 18

<u>*dB A*</u> means the composite abbreviation for the A-weighted sound level and the unit of sound level, the decibel.

1	Existing natural waterway shall mean an area of navigable water that is naturally
2	created and unaltered. This definition specifically excludes any and all manmade trails, without
3	regard to the length of their existence or reason for their creation.
4	Idle speed means that a watercraft operating within any such area must be throttled
5	down to the point where the engine is just above a stall. At idle speed, a watercraft or vessel
6	should cast little or no wake.
7	Jumping of roadways shall mean the propulsion of a watercraft onto or over any
8	roadway.
9	No entry zone means an area where no vessel of any kind shall be permitted within the
10	designated area.
11	Operation means to have actual control and/or the ability to have control of the vessel,
12	whether moving or not, whether the engines are powered or running, or not.
13	Person means any person, firm, corporation, public agency or legal entity.
14	Seagrasses shall refer to all underwater and aquatic grasses, grass beds and grass bed
15	communities and shall have the same meaning as the terms "seagrasses" and "seagrass beds"
16	are used within Chapter 62 of the Florida Administrative Code.
17	Seagrass regeneration special protection zones shall refer to those marsh and coastal
18	areas lying westward of Hernando Beach but excluding the Bayport Seagrass Protection Zones
19	(as separately defined), as generally delineated on appendix map A [attached to Ordinance No.
20	2008-22] (incorporated herein by reference and made a part hereof), designated to protect

1	seagrasses and environmentally sensitive zones. The actual delineation of these zones shall be
2	by signage at appropriate points around the perimeter of each zone.
3	Slow speed/minimum wake zone means that a vessel operating within any such area
4	must be fully off plane and completely settled into the water. It may not proceed at a speed
5	greater than that speed which is reasonable and prudent to avoid the creation of an excessive
6	wake or other hazardous condition under the existing circumstances.
7	Sound level means the A-weighted sound pressure level measured with fast response
8	using an instrument complying with the specification for sound level meters of the American
9	National Standard Institute, Inc., or its successor bodies, except that only a weighting and fast
10	dynamic response be needed.
11	Trail means any defined area where continuous previous usage is evident.
12	Vessel means any type of boat or floating craft and includes all watercraft.
13	Watercraft means any type of boat or floating craft which is propelled or powered by
14	an engine or motor. Examples of watercraft include, without limitation, ships, yachts,
15	motorboats, tugboats, jet boats, jet skis, airboats, hovercrafts, hydrofoils, seaplanes, and
16	sailboats containing any motorized drive or propeller.
17	Waters of this state means any navigable waters of the United States within the
18	territorial limits of Florida, the marginal sea adjacent to this state and the high seas when
19	navigated as a part of a journey or ride to or from the shore of this state, and all the inland
20	lakes, rivers, and canals under the jurisdiction of this state.

1	Sec. 7-73. Operation of vessels, watercraft and airboats; prohibited conduct.
2	(a) The noise level attained by any watercraft shall not be of sufficient volume as
3	to unreasonably disturb or inconvenience the general public or residents of adjacent areas and
4	which would otherwise exceed the sound level limits (in decibels) set forth in the Hernando
5	County Noise Control Ordinance as contained in chapter 21, article VIII of this Code. No
6	person shall operate or give permission for the operation of any vessel on the waters of the
7	state within the jurisdictional boundaries of Hernando County, or on a specified portion of the
8	waters thereof, in such a manner as to exceed the following sound level at a distance of 50 feet
9	from the vessel: for all vessels, a maximum sound level of 90 dB A.
10	(b) Any person operating a vessel on the waters of the state within the jurisdictional
11	boundaries of Hernando County who refuses to submit to a sound level test when requested
12	to do so by a law enforcement officer is guilty of a misdemeanor of the second degree,
13	punishable as provided in sections 775.082 or 775.083, Florida Statutes (2023), or by Chapter
14	2, Article III, of the Hernando County Code.
15	(b)(c) Airboats are to remain at least one thousand (1,000) feet from any dwelling
16	while in operation. This shall not include airboats leaving or returning to a port, ramp or
17	residence, or airboats operating within a marked channel or seaward of a marked channel.
18	(c)(d) Operation of vessels shall be limited to existing natural waterways and marked
19	or designated channels. Vessels shall not operate in a no entry zone. This subsection shall not
20	apply to residents or owners of property whose sole access to said property is via any

1	watercraft; however, all other provisions of this section, such as slow speed shall still apply
2	to the maximum extent necessary to such residents or owners of property.
3	(d)(e) Idle speed shall be maintained within any area posted as slow speed/minimum
4	wake zone pursuant to this article or article II of this chapter.
5	(c)(f) The jumping of any roadway by any watercraft shall be prohibited on any
6	property owned and/or maintained by Hernando County. No watercraft shall, under its own
7	power, travel on or across any roadway, parking lot, other public area, or over land.
8	(f)(g) Vessels shall not operate in any manner that shall damage or destroy existing
9	marshes or seagrasses.
10	(g)(h) Watercraft and barges shall be prohibited from entering into, crossing over, or
11	operating within any designated seagrass regeneration special protection zone.
12	(h)(i) Except for violations of subsection (b) of this section, Each each act of violating
13	any of the foregoing provisions shall constitute a separate offense infraction enforceable
14	according to section 327.73(1), Florida Statutes (2023)., which may be cited or enforced by
15	any means authorized by this Code or applicable law. A citation issued pursuant to this section
16	shall not preclude any other fine or remedy available under any other provision of this Code
17	or applicable state or federal law.
18	Section 2. Severability. It is declared to be the intent of the Board of County Commissioners
19	that if any section, subsection, clause, sentence, phrase, or provision of this ordinance is for any reason
20	held unconstitutional or invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect the validity of the remaining

1 portions of this ordinance.

2	Section 3. Inclusion in the Code. It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners
3	of Hernando County, Florida, and it is hereby provided, that the provisions of this Ordinance shall
4	become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of Hernando County, Florida. To this end, the
5	sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or relettered to accomplish such intention, and that the
6	word "ordinance" may be changed to "section," "article," or any other appropriate designation.
7	Section 4. Conflicting Provisions Repealed. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict
8	with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.
9	Section 5. Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon receipt of
10	official acknowledgment from the office of the Secretary of State of Florida that this ordinance has
11	been filed with said office.
