2 3	AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF HERNANDO COUNTY, FLORIDA AMENDING CHAPTER 6 OF THE	
4	HERNANDO COUNTY CODE, ENTITLED "ANIMALS," TO PROVIDE FOR	
5	THE CREATION OF A TRAP-NEUTER-RETURN PROGRAM FOR	
6	HERNANDO COUNTY, AND TO REMOVE REDUNDANT SECTION	
7	RELATED TO ENFORCEMENT; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY;	
8	PROVIDING FOR INCLUSION IN THE CODE; PROVIDING FOR THE REPEAL	
9	OF CONFLICTING PROVISIONS; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE	
10	DATE.

12	WHEREAS, the proliferation of stray and feral cats and feral cat colonies in Hernando	
13	County results in recurring expenditures of public funds and resources to trap as many cats as	
14	possible, adopt out those that are capable of being socialized, and euthanize those that are not	
15	socialized or that are not adopable; and,	
16	WHEREAS, the aforementioned, recurring expenditures of public funds and resources are	
17	generally not offset by the permanent removal of some stray or feral cats from a colony, as the	
18	remaining cats continue to reproduce and create the need for further action and expenditure on the	
19	part of Hernando County Animal Services; and,	
20	WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Hernando County finds that programs	
21	known as 'Trap-Neuter-Return' (TNR) have the potential to control stray and feral cat population	
22	growth while preventing the euthanasia of the cats, and reducing, on a long-term basis, the	
23	expenditure of public funds toward the removal, sheltering and disposition of such cats; and,	
24	WHEREAS, as currently written, Hernando County Code would not permit the maintenance	
25	of stray and/or feral cat colonies by a caregiver, or would treat the caregiver as operating a kennel,	

1	and must be amended in order to implement a TNR program; and,	
2	WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners hereby deems it to be in the best interest	
3	of the citizens of Hernando County to amend Hernando County Code, Chapter 6, entitled "Animals",	
4	in order to create a TNR program in Hernando County; and,	
5	WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners is obligated from time to time to review	
6	and update existing ordinances that are inconsistent and/or outdated; and,	
7	WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners finds that Hernando County Code § 6-73	
8	is redundant as it concerns the same subject matter as Hernando County Code § 6-6.	
9	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of County Commissioners of	
10	Hernando County, Florida, as follows:	
11	Section 1. Recitals. The foregoing recitals are true and correct and incorporated herein by	
12	reference.	
13	Section 2. Amending Hernando County Code § 6-2. Hernando County Code § 6-2,	
14	Definitions, is amended to add the following definitions: ¹	
15	Community Cat shall mean a stray cat which has been spayed/neutered, vaccinated,	
16	and ear-tipped.	
17	Community Cat Caregiver means a person who, in accordance with a	
18	Trap-Neuter-Return ("TNR") Program, provides care to a Community Cat. A

1	Community Cat Caregiver shall not be considered the owner or harborer of a
2	Community Cat. The provision of care to a Community Cat by a Community Cat
3	Caregiver shall not be considered a "use" of real property that is regulated by
4	Hernando County's land development regulations.
5	Department means the Hernando County Animal Services Department, or its
6	designee.
7	Eartipping means straight-line cutting of the tip of the left ear of a cat while the cat
8	is anesthetized.
9	Feral cat means a cat that is born in the wild or is the offspring of an owned or feral
10	cat and is not socialized or is a formerly owned cat that has been abandoned and is
11	no longer socialized.
12	Nuisance means, for purposes of a TNR Program, conduct by a Community Cat that
13	includes, but is not limited to habitually or continually howling, crying or screaming
14	or habitually and significantly destroying, desecrating or soiling property against the
15	wishes of the owner of the property.
16	TNR means trap, neuter and return.
17	TNR Program means a protocol pursuant to which stray cats are trapped, neutered
18	or spayed, eartipped, vaccinated against rabies, and returned to the location where
19	they congregate, in accordance with this article.

	Section 3. Amending Hernando County Code § 6-33. Hernando County Code § 6-33,	
	Unlawful to Keep Stray Animal, is amended to read as follows:	
	It shall be unlawful for any person to harbor, feed and/or keep any stray animal unless	
	he or she has notified animal services within twenty-four (24) hours from the time	
	such animal came into his or her possession. Community Cat Caregivers who are	
	participating in a bona fide, Animal Services-administered TNR Program are not	
	subject to this section.	
	Section 4. Amending Hernando County Code § 6-41(c). Hernando County Code § 6-	
,	41(c), Impoundment, is amended to read as follows:	
	(c) Except as provided for in \S 6-36, the animal shelter may adopt out or release	
	impounded cats after three (3) days and may euthanize impounded cats after five (5)	
	days, measured from the date of impoundment. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the	
	county veterinarian or his/her designee may euthanize an impounded cat if such	
	animal is in imminent danger of death from disease or trauma or is determined to be	
	feral and unsuitable for TNR. Euthanasia of cats to prevent overcrowding will be	
	conducted using the following priorities, to be determined by the county veterinarian	
	or his/her designee:	
	(1) Sick, diseased, or injured;	
	(2) Feral and unsuitable for TNR;	
	(3) Unadoptable.

Section 5. Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR)	Program. A new Hernando County Code §					
be entitled "Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR) Program," is hereby enacted to read as follows:						
(a) The purpose of this section is to	authorize the implementation of a TNR					
 Program, in order to reduce the population of feral and stray cats as a means to lessen the euthanasia of such cats. (b) A feral or stray cat impounded by Animal Services shall be evaluated for disease, health condition, temperament, and behavior for adoptability purposes. (c) If a healthy feral or stray cat is diverted to the TNR Program, it shall be sterilized so that it can no longer reproduce, eartipped, vaccinated against rabies and 						
				returned to the location where it was found or trapped, unless an alternative location is approved through the Animal Services Manager in writing.

1	(e) The Animal Services Manager may formulate written procedures to
2	implement the provisions of this Section, subject to the approval of the Board of
3	County Commissioners.
4	(f) Notwithstanding the foregoing, Animal Services may immediately destroy
5	any Community Cat that becomes a nuisance, becomes infected or afflicted with
6	disease, develops an aggressive temperament, or otherwise poses a threat to the
7	public's health and safety.
8	Section 6. Repeal of Redundant Civil Penalty Provision. Hernando County Code § 6-37,
9	"Civil Penalties for Violations of this Chapter," is hereby repealed.
10	Section 7. Sunset Provision. With the exception of Section 6 above, the provisions of this
11	ordinance will be null, void, and of no force and effect on or after November 1, 2023.
12	Section 8. Severability. It is declared to be the intent of the Board of County
13	Commissioners that if any section, subsection, clause, sentence, phrase, or provision of this
14	ordinance is for any reason held unconstitutional or invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect the
15	validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.
16	Section 9. Inclusion in the Code. It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners
17	of Hernando County, Florida, and it is hereby provided, that the provisions of this Ordinance shall
18	become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of Hernando County, Florida. To this end, the
19	section of this Ordinance may be renumbered or relettered to accomplish such intention, and that the
20	word "ordinance" may be changed to "section," "article," or other appropriate designation.

Section 10. Conflicting Provision	s Repealed. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in	
conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.		
Section 11. Effective Date. This of	ordinance shall take effect immediately upon receipt of
