1 **Sec. 28-243. - Wastewater effluent requirements.**

2 (a) (1) *Pretreatment requirement for non-domestic source pollutants.* Any
3 producer of non-domestic source pollutants that pass through,
4 interfere with, or are otherwise incompatible with the department's
5 wastewater treatment plants and/or systems shall comply with Federal
6 Pretreatment Standards in 40 CFR Part 403 or other applicable
7 federal laws or rules regulating pretreatment for such pollutants; as
8 may be amended from time to time, ~~and~~ with any applicable
9 requirements of Florida Statutes or administrative rules or regulations
10 adopted thereunder, as such laws or rules may be amended from time
11 to time, and with Hernando County's Industrial Wastewater
12 Pretreatment Policy Manual, as may be amended from time to time,
13 as if such federal laws or rules, state laws or rule, or the Industrial
14 Wastewater Pretreatment Policy Manual were set forth fully herein.
15 Each producer shall install necessary pretreatment requirements at
16 producer's own expense, prior to connecting to the district sanitary
17 sewer facilities.

18 (2) *County and department review.* County departments or officials with
19 review authority over new industrial use siting or construction,

1 including but not limited to growth and development services or
2 successor agencies, the building official, airport staff and any
3 economic development office, shall promptly notify the department
4 whenever staff of such departments or officials become aware of any
5 existing or potential issue concerning pretreatment for non-domestic
6 source pollutants, and the department shall conduct an independent
7 review and advise any current user or applicant for approval of site or
8 building plans as to the applicability of this section or other relevant
9 provisions of ordinances or state or federal laws, rules or regulations
10 that may affect such use.

11 (3) No substance may be discharged into the sanitary sewers which could
12 be injurious thereto or potentially dangerous to the public or which
13 exceeds domestic waste standards.

14 (b) *Non-sanitary waste prohibited.* There shall be no connections for surface
15 drainage, storm water or any non-sanitary waste into the district's sanitary
16 sewer facilities within or without the limits of the Hernando County Water
17 and Sewer District, nor shall anyone knowingly discharge surface drainage,
18 storm water or any non-sanitary waste into the district's sanitary sewer
19 facilities. As used herein, non-sanitary waste shall be defined as synonymous

1 with the phrase "prohibited discharge" under federal laws, rules or regulations
2 applicable to discharges to publicly owned treatment works.

3 (c) *Fats, oils and greases (FOG)*. Any person or entity disposing of fats, oils or
4 greases (FOG), including but not limited to waste petroleum, sand or grease
5 products, through the district sanitary sewer systems shall:

6 (1) Provide for an appropriately sized and configured grease and/or sand
7 trap or other device approved in writing by the department through
8 which the FOG shall pass before entering the district sanitary sewer
9 lines;

10 (2) Obtain approval of such trap or device design by the building official
11 or designee, with advice as may be required or desirable from the
12 department;

13 (3) Provide for connection of such trap or device with the district sanitary
14 sewer line;

15 (4) Provide reasonable access to the department for inspection of such
16 trap or device and pay a surcharge to be established by board
17 resolution for each such inspection, which inspections shall occur
18 when the department deems it reasonably necessary to ensure the
19 continued proper operation of the department's sanitary sewer lines or

Section 4. Conflicting Provisions Repealed. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 5. Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon receipt of official acknowledgment from the office of the Secretary of State of Florida that this ordinance has been filed with said office.
